Special Undergraduate Registrations.

400 - 499 Graduate courses indicating study at the Master's level.

500 - 599 Advanced graduate courses usually at the Doctoral level.

Prior to 1980, in addition to the Teacher's grade for the lesson-work in applied music, a student may receive a Roman Numeral Grade for Performance in the Jury Examinationwhich must be taken to receive credit for the degree.

To be eligible for distinction, a student must have completed at least 60 semester hours in residence and must show no "incompletes" on his or her record.
