² A student enrolled in ETH 485 Fieldwork: Research and Analysis during the process of writing a fieldwork-based thesis may use this course to fulfill the requirement for ETH 495: MA Thesis if permission has been granted by both the students¹ advisor and the instructor of the course.

- Elective courses must be numbered 200 or higher. Arts Leadership (ALC) courses do not count for elective credit. Students may enroll in additional world music ensembles for elective credit (to a maximum of two additional credits) and/or take an ETH independent study. Electives may include up to six (6) credits of applied music study. There is no foreign language requirement for this major, except in those instances where the knowledge of a foreign language is essential to research or other work in a specific field.
- Comprehensive Oral Exam: The comprehensive exam is taken after the thesis proposal has been submitted and approved by a committee consisting of three professors who are familiar with the student's work. The examination will be structured in two parts: part one will focus on the student's course work; part two will include questions pertaining to the thesis. The degree will be awarded when the exam is completed satisfactorily and the thesis has been approved by all members of the committee.
