⁴ Elective courses must be numbered 200 or higher. Arts Leadership (ALC) courses do not count towards the required units for the degree. The total number of ensembles and/or chamber music units counted toward the degree may not exceed four (4). This restriction includes all ENS and CHB courses, required or elective, with the exception of repertoire courses (CHB 401, 403, ENS 450, 451 or 452). Electives may include no more than six (6) units of non-music courses. Neither primary nor secondary lessons maybe used as elective credit.

⁵ MHS 435: Concert Repertoire may also be counted as an elective.

⁶ Students give a degree recital on classical guitar in the first year and on lute or historical guitar in the second year.
