Minimum semester hours for piano primary concentration: 142

- [1] MEG students may have 1 semester of large ensemble waived for full-time student teaching if not in the FORTE program, resulting in 14 units of large ensemble. Students in the FORTE program must complete 16 units.
- [2] Students are required to take 3 of the instrument classes: MTL 221-1 cr., MTL 225-1 cr., MTL 231-2 cr., MTL 232-2 cr., MTL 255-1 cr., resulting in a minimum of 3 units. [3] The student must enroll for 24 total units in Humanities/Science, including first year writing seminar. See Academic Policy Handbook for information concerning electives.
- [4] Students who place into TH 100/105 will start the Theory sequence in fall of their first year and are not required to take TH 230. Students who place into TH 110/115 begin
- the Theory sequence in the spring of their first year and will continue through TH 230.
- [5] Choose MTL 217 or 218, resulting in 2 units (MTL 218 offered Fall only / MTL 217 offered Spring only).
- [6] Choose JCM 201 or 202, resulting in 2 units. (JCM 201 offered Fall only / JCM 202 offered Spring only).
  [7] Music History classes do not have to be taken together in chronological order. Students may begin to take MHS 120s starting their sophomore year. Students must complete MHS 121, 122 and 123 before enrolling in a 200 level MHS course.
- [8] Choose CMP 244 or 250, resulting in 2 units. (CMP 244 offered Fall only / CMP 250 offered Spring only).

#### Important things to remember:

Variations from the prescribed program of study should be approved in advance by the appropriate Eastman department and appropriate documentation must be on file in the Registrar's office.

Bachelor of Music students must complete **eight semesters of full-time** college-level study earning no fewer than **120 units**. Students must be registered for 12 units each semester to be considered full-time. Students who earn advanced standing in any subject must complete an equivalent number of optional elective units toward their required total degree units.

Upon receipt of an official transcript, a maximum of two college-level courses up to 8 units with a grade of B- or better may be used as **transfer unit** after matriculation.

All Bachelor of Music students must complete FWS 121 plus 20 additional units of Humanities & Sciences courses of at least 4 units each. Any course over 4 units must be approved by the Humanities Department Chair. In some majors (voice and theory), required language classes count toward this requirement.
