² The candidate must play in a large jazz ensemble every semester that he/she is in residence. After registering for 2 units of ENS 400], the student may opt to continue in ENS 400] and receive 1 unit per semester (up to a maximum of 4 units), or register for ENS 401] for no unit. The total number of ensembles and/or chamber music units counted toward the degree may not exceed four (4). This restriction includes all ENS and CHB courses, required or elective, with the exception of repertoire courses.

³ The student, in consultation with the advisor, will choose 8 additional hours of coursework depending on his/her background, needs, and interests. At least 2-3 hours of elective coursework must be from outside the JCM department. Elective courses must be numbered 200 or higher. Arts Leadership (ALC) courses do not count towards the required units for the degree. Writing skills majors are encouraged to elect orchestration, composition for non-majors, woodwind/brass/percussion methodology, or advanced composition courses that will directly benefit their composing and arranging skills. Electives may include up to six (6) units of applied music study.

⁴ Normally two years will be needed to complete the coursework. Candidates will take a jury (jazz) during the first graduate year. The graduation recital in the spring semester of the second year will include performance of original works and arrangements created by the student under the guidance of the jazz writing skills faculty.
