

## Advanced Diploma Concertmaster Studies Advising Worksheet

Students in the Advanced Diploma in Concertmaster Studies may use this checklist to complete a self-assessment of their progress. A student can log into UR Student and access their academic history in order to fill this document out to determine if they're on track to graduate or see what remaining requirements they have left. Students can schedule an appointment with the Associate Director of Graduate Advising and Services at any time to verify their progress and address any concerns or questions.

In order to graduate from the Eastman School of Music and the University of Rochester with this diploma, a student must complete a minimum of 18 credits. Students are required to complete two consecutive semesters of full-time status (9 units) to satisfy the residency requirement.

The following checklist lists out all of the requirements needed to earn an Advanced Diploma in Concertmaster Studies.

<sup>1</sup> ESM ALP and Music Leadership courses, TBD, surrounding the following topics:

- Contract negotiation as it relates to Concertmaster compensation and solo recitals/chamber music/concerto appearances
- Donor relations – this might include things like: playing house concerts to help fundraising, interacting with high level donors, etc.
- Leadership courses:
  - Public Speaking
  - Donor Cultivation
  - Community Outreach
  - Conflict Resolution/Mediation
- Limited additional electives, which could include:
  - Additional large ensembles and/or chamber music
  - Conducting class (or independent study with Neil Varon to discuss orchestral issues and explore scores to learn more orchestral awareness)

Students should consult the Concertmaster Studies Program Coordinator when selecting elective courses. Should further consultation be needed, students should see the Associate Director of Graduate Advising and Services.

<sup>2</sup> Concertmaster practicum is to be completed in final semester of study. Concertmaster Practicum where students in the program will meet with leaders from all departments of the RPO, including Music Director (and possibly guest conductors), in order to learn the function of different administrative departments of an orchestra (possible examples include CEO, Music Director, Guest Conductors, VP Artistic Operations, VP Finance, VP Human Resources, VP Education and Outreach, and Personnel Manager).

<sup>3</sup> Mock Audition Capstone project is to be completed in final semester of study. Final capstone project will be a mock orchestral audition in front of select ESM faculty and musicians from the RPO. In preparation for this final capstone project, students will perform multiple additional mock auditions throughout the academic year for a variety of different audiences, including the Concertmaster Studies Program Coordinator, graduate student conductors, guest artists, and others from Eastman and the broader musical community.
