² Course numbers must be at the 200-level or above, taken from a variety of courses offered at Eastman and/or the River Campus according to the student's interests. Arts Leadership (ALC) courses do not count towards the required units for the degree. Electives may include up to 3 units of applied music study or ensemble participation.

³ As a culminating demonstration of professional capability in the major field, the student will submit a final project that demonstrates advanced competence in research and writing in music history or musicology. The final project may be a thesis, a series of special papers, or written work of equivalent scope and depth. Students will devise individualized topics and carry out research with the guidance of a faculty advisor.

⁴ Students admitted to the musicology MA program are required to demonstrate proficiency in understanding written musicological (or musicology-related) texts in German, French, or Italian. A student whose field of specialization requires a different language may petition the department to substitute it. Students are required to pass an exam administered by the musicology department, whether or not they take coursework to prepare for this exam. Students are encouraged to take the exam in the first semester of study.
