Biographical Sketch

Sharon Kay Bennett (*b*. September 17, 1939, Wester Jefferson, Ohio; *d*. July 26, 2023, Columbus, Ohio) was a noted coloratura soprano and music educator who performed extensively throughout the United States, Europe, Africa, and the Middle East.

Ms. Bennett grew up in Plain City, Ohio. During her youth, she was active in several musical and academic school organizations and also served as a director of the Presbyterian Church carol and youth choirs. In 1956, at the age of 16, she enrolled as an undergraduate at the Eastman School of Music and ultimately earned a Bachelor of Music (1960), Performer's Certificate (1961),

and Master of Music (1962) from the institution. She also performed for one year with the Metropolitan Opera Studio, where she was coached by George Schick.

In 1958, Ms. Bennett made her professional operatic debut as Lauretta in Puccini's *Gianni Schicchi*. In the 1960s, she appeared in operas throughout the US, which included performances with the Chautauqua Opera, Santa Fe Opera Company, and the Turnau Opera Company. She also appeared in concert with the Cleveland Orchestra, National Symphony, and Columbus Symphony and performed recitals at various colleges and universities in the eastern and southeastern United States. In 1970, Ms. Bennett made her European debut as a member of the Nuremberg Opera Company, after which, in 1973, she joined the Hamburg State Opera. In the 1970s, she appeared frequently as a guest artist in Munich, Frankfurt, Cologne, and Stuttgart, playing such roles as Ophelia (*Hamlet*), Lucia (*Lucia di Lammermoor*), Zerlina (*Don Giovanni*), Gretel (*Hansel und Gretel*), and most notably Gilda (*Rigoletto*) and the Queen of the Night (*Die Zauberflöte*). Her performance career took her far beyond Germany, however: she sang internationally in Scotland, Ireland, England, South Africa, Israel, and Spain, as well as the United States, and she also appeared on camera in a full-length feature film for the Dutch television station Nederlandse Omroep Stichting (NOS) and on *Unsolved Mysteries* in the US.

In 1980, Ms. Bennett joined the teaching faculty at the University of Iowa as an Assistant Professor of Music. In 1985, she returned to Ohio, where she continued teaching, initially as an adjunct instructor at Capital University (1985–1992) and Otterbein College (1986–1987) before being hired as an Assistant Professor at Capital University in 1992. In 1994, she began teaching full-time at Capital University, where she ended her career after more than 20 years of teaching. Over her long performing and teaching career, Ms. Bennett received multiple grants and awards, which included the Detroit Grand Opera Association Francis Robinson Professional Engagement Award (1985) as well as the Women of Achievement Award for the Arts from the Columbus YWCA (1986).

Ms. Bennett passed away peacefully on July 26, 2023, at the age of 83, after a battle with cancer.

Provenance

The Sharon K. Bennett Papers were the gift of Ms. Bennett's nephew, Phillip Bennett, and his wife Vickie Bennett. The collection was received by Sibley Music Library in November 2023.

Scope and Content

The Sharon K. Bennett Papers is small collection of personal papers—comprising concert programs, press clippings, publicity materials, awards, photographs, and audio recordings—that document Ms. Bennett's career as a performing artist. The most substantial material in the collection is the series of photographs, which is comprised of 82 individual photographic prints, negatives, and slides; 16 scrapbook pages with additional photographic prints; and a USB drive containing 50 image files. The bulk of the photographs depict Ms. Bennett in costume or on stage

during the height of her operatic career in the 1970s. The five audiocassette tapes in the collection are recordings of Ms. Bennett performing operatic or concert works.

There are no restrictions on the use of the Collection. Requests for reproductions of material protected by U.S. Copyright Law and its revisions will be granted only upon presentation of the written permission of all associated copyright holder(s).

Associations

RTWSC possesses several special collections relating to concert and opera singers active during the twentieth century, including the papers of a handful of Eastman alumni and faculty. The Leonard Treash Collection, which documents Mr. Treash's work as a director with Eastman Opera Theatre, the Chautauqua Opera Association, and other opera companies, may of particular interest, as Ms. Bennett performed with the Chautauqua Opera Association during its 1977 season. The performing and teaching career of another Eastman voice alumnae, Jane Günther-McCoy (BM 1959), a professional choral singer and soloist, is preserved in the Seth McCoy and Jane Günther-McCoy Collection, which also documents the career of her husband, Eastman Professor of Voice, Seth McCoy. Further, RTWSC holds the collections of Eastman voice faculty Jan DeGaetani and Tom Paul as well as the collections of sopranos Josephine Antoine, Olga Tremelli, and Dorothea Dix Lawrence.

DESCRIPTION OF SERIES

Series 1: Papers

Series 1 contains concert programs, press clippings, publicity materials, artist directories, and awards collected by Ms. Bennett over the course of her performing career. The programs and press clippings date from 1962–1993, though the bulk of the materials date from the 1970s during the height of Ms. Bennett's operatic and performing career. Also among the papers are a facsimile of Ms. Bennett's Eastman School of Music transcripts, a program from the YWCA First Annual Women of Achievement Awards Tribute Luncheon in (at which Ms. Bennett was presented with the 1986 Eleanor Gelpi Award), and three items of correspondence.

Series 2: Photographs

Series 2 is comprised of photographic prints, negatives, slides, scrapbook pages (which contain additional photographic prints), and a USB drive containing 50 image files. The bulk of the images depict Ms. Bennett in costume or on stage in performance, thus providing rich documentation of Ms. Bennett's operatic career. Further, a handful of personal photographs dating from Ms. Bennett's early career in Europe (1970s) are included in the scrapbook pages, and additional photographs from her later years after her operatic career are included among the image files on the USB drive.

Series 3: Audio recordings

Series 3 contains five audiocassette tapes with recorded performances by Ms. Bennett of operatic and concert works.
