**International students are charged an international student fee of approximately \$53 each semester.

- **All students** are required to have health insurance. If you are not covered under your parent(s) or your own health insurance, then add \$3,492 (22-23 rate) for the University Health Insurance.
- **New graduate students** have a one-time orientation fee of \$314.
- **All organists** are charged an organ fee of \$290 per semester.
- According to the Department of Education's Student Financial Aid Handbook, "The Cost of Attendance (COA) is an estimate of a student's educational expenses for a period of enrollment". A student's COA is used to determine financial aid eligibility. The basic components of an Eastman student's COA include tuition and fees, books, housing, food, and miscellaneous (travel and personal) expenses.
- The COA may be adjusted on an individual basis for dependent care, study abroad program, and loan fees. These adjustments will only increase a student's loan eligibility. All adjustments must be supported by documentation. Students who wish to be considered for a COA adjustment for any reason should contact the Financial Aid Office to discuss both the changes and the additional loan eligibility that may result.
