~ MEET THE ARTIST ~

Catherine Reid is a senior Harp Performance major in the studio of Kathleen Bride at the Eastman School of Music, where she performs regularly in Eastman's large ensembles. She has performed with Musica Nova and participates as a therapeutic musician in the University of Rochester Medical Center's Eastman Performing Arts Medicine program. An avid chamber musician, Catherine cofounded the Tedeschi Trio with Eastman violinist Artur Korotin and cellist Gabriel Hennebury. The trio's 2022 performance of Luigi Tedeschi's Suite for violin, cello and harp received the highest score of their division and a Platinum ranking in the Quebec Classical Music Competition. Catherine's 2022 jury performance earned an Eastman Performance Certificate.

A native of Baltimore, Maryland, Catherine studied harp with Michaela Trnkova and piano with Marjorie Liss. Catherine's concert performances included as a 2019 concerto soloist with the Mid-Atlantic Symphony Orchestra, conducted by Andrews Sill, and ensemble performances at Carnegie Hall, Kimmel Center and the French Embassy. She has participated in Bowdoin International Music Festival, Boston University Tanglewood Institute, Interlochen Arts Camp, and the Curtis Summer Harp Colony, and has played in master classes with Caroline Lizotte, Elizabeth Remy Johnson, Jessica Zhou, and Isabelle Moretti. She will be pursuing a Master of Music in Performance from the Royal College of Music in London beginning in September 2023. Catherine's passions also include architecture and her hedgehog, Stuart.
