THE ADVANCED CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT IN THE PEDAGOGY OF MUSIC THEORY

This Advanced Certificate of Achievement offers a course of study for current Eastman students interested in exploring and advancing their skills in teaching music theory, in preparation for a career that combines performance and teaching. The Advanced Certificate of Achievement consists of course work and mentored teaching experiences, and is open to all ESM graduate students (MM, MA, DMA, and PhD). Its requirements can be met under the electives category of the DMA, usually without adding time to degree completion (if begun early enough). If added to an existing master's degree, it is likely to take an additional year to complete.

In addition to this form, the applicant must submit an ESM transcript (unofficial is acceptable) and a <u>2-page personal statement</u> describing his/her experience with teaching and with music theory, as well as the applicant's motivation to pursue the Advanced Certificate of Achievement. A recommendation from at least one Eastman professor is also required, preferably from a professor in Music Theory. Typically, applicants will already have completed 1-2 theory courses at Eastman (beyond TH 117-118).

After reviewing the applications, faculty will invite a select group of students to interview for the Advanced Certificate of Achievement. Applicants must demonstrate skills in sight-singing and error detection, keyboard (sight-reading, figured bass, harmonic progressions), and at-sight analysis—as well as good pedagogical instincts in conversation with the faculty. The interview may be waived for current Theory TAs.

No more than four students will be accepted into the certificate program each year. Students who are interested in applying are urged to contact Assistant Professor Sarah Marlowe (smarlowe@esm.rochester.edu).
